### **PRESIDENT – 1-year term Kiki Sonnen**

### **BOARD MEMBER - Monica Bryand**

Monica is the founder of Urban Bird Collective, a non-profit community-based organization that provides safe and welcoming spaces for BIPOC and the LGBT community in the Twin Cities. Her career includes working for philanthropic foundations, community-based organizations, and consulting agencies. Monica also works as a scorer, announcer, and support staff for the U of M's athletic department.

### **BOARD MEMBER - Craig Cox**
